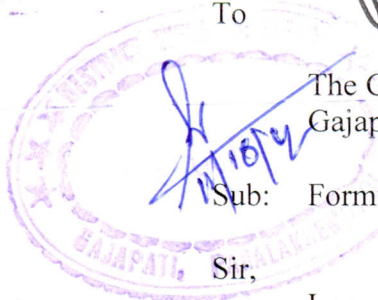

Sir,

I am directed to bring it to your notice that Gajapati District has been identified as a backward minority concentrated district which is falling far behind the national average in terms of both socio-economic and basic amenities parameter. As per 2001 Census, there are 1,73,663 Christians, 1972 Buddhists, 1623 Muslims, 7 Jains in Gajapati. To make up such deficit in the District, the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India is contemplating to formulate a Multi-Sectoral Development Plan for Gajapati.

While drafting the Multi-Sectoral Development Plan, thrust may be given on education, health & sanitation, safe drinking water, communication, women & child development activities, public distribution system, horticulture, Sericulture, soil conservation, Forestry, agriculture, increase irrigation potential, skill up-gradation activities, setting up I.T.I., enhanced credit linkage facilities, infrastructure development, Tele connectivity/ Village Public Telephones, Self employment and Wage employment, Improvement of Slum inhabited by Minorities, Rural Housing Scheme, Rural Electrification, Pisciculture, Animal Husbandry etc.

In the aforesaid premises, you are requested to please prepare a Module on Multi-Sectoral Development Plan of Gajapati with critical data, as a Team of Experts from the Ministry of Minority Affairs, Government of India, are likely to visit Gajapati shortly to make a baseline survey on this matter.
